EUGENE COMMUNITY

Eugene is the second largest city in Oregon with a population of 165,997, while the Eugene/Springfield metro area has a population of 61,925. Nearby institutions of higher learning are: University of Oregon, Northwest Christian University, Pacific University (satellite), New Hope Christian College, and Lane Community College. Eugene is home to world-renowned forests and rivers, bike and running trails, the NCAA and Olympic track trials, and the historic Hayward Field.

SHELDON COMMUNITY

Sheldon is one of the five area high schools in the Eugene 4j School District. Our high school is a four-year comprehensive school with yearly enrollment of approximately 1,435 (Sept. 2020). We are **accredited** by the Northwest Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. Sheldon has an certified FTE of 55.74, and 100% of our teachers are Highly Qualified.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Economically disadvantaged: 28%, mobile students: 10.5%, students with disabilities: 11%; different languages spoken: 17, graduation rate: 87.6%, drop out rate: .9%, Pacific Islander 1%, Asian 4%, Black/African American 2%, Hispanic/Latino 13%, Multiracial 9%, White 70%. TRIMESTER SYSTEM

Sheldon High School operates on a "Trimester" Block schedule of a five period day. Each course of regular Comprehensive, Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), College Now (CN) earns a .5 credit. This equates to two "trimesters" of Language Arts for 1.0 credit or 1 year. An elective course of .5 credit could then fill the open/remaining "trimester". It is also possible, due to logistics, a course could be split into the 1st / 3rd trimester, or the 2nd / 3rd trimester, or the 1st / 2nd trimester. In any case ALL Comprehensive/Classic courses are equal to two "trimesters" of .5 credit for a total of 1.0. However, the IHS courses are spread out over the entire year (three trimesters). In IHS, the subjects of LA and SS with the IHS designation are .34, .33, .33 credit for 1.0 credit. IHS students then take their MA, SC, and WL (AF - World Language) in the Comprehensive credit format of .5.

COVID SPRING 2020

Much like the rest of the world, Oregon schools were highly impacted by the Covid pandemic. For Spring of 2020: All classes were on a Pass (P), Incomplete (I) or WD (Withdraw). Governor's orders were reflected to hold students harmless during this time so no letter grades of A-F were assigned. Some College Now classes were also impacted in that they received high school credit but not the college credit due to articulation issues.

INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL (IHS), INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE (IB)

Eugene International High School is an IB World School that exists on three campuses in the 4j school district that are a "school within a school model." Henry D. Sheldon High School is one of the host campuses, therefore, students who are co-enrolled take their EIHS course work in a year-long, three day rotation in the afternoon or morning. The rest of the student's day allows them to take science, world language, and math.

Entry to Eugene IHS is through the 4J School Choice lottery. Eugene IHS is a rigorous college preparatory school that emphasizes a study of world history, literature and cultures. Students are required to take three years of a world language, write a 3500-4000 word research paper, and document 150 hours of Creativity, Activity, and Service to meet IHS graduation requirements and the IB full diploma Core requirements (CAS, TOK, EE). Across the 11th and 12th grades, students have the option of working toward the International Baccalaureate Diploma by completing coursework and taking comprehensive examinations in six subject areas.

INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL: SPANISH IMMERSION (SI)

Students who are also enrolled in the Spanish Immersion (SI) program take four years of Spanish Literature/Composition courses and Spanish-language content courses when offered. The Spanish Immersion (SI) program within Eugene

International High School at Sheldon High School builds upon the foundation established by Buena Vista Elementary School and Monroe Middle School, while also celebrating our own rich history of excellence and student achievement while being immersed in a world language for up to 13 years. We are dedicated to providing a rigorous academic course of study within a supportive community that honors cultural diversity and values bilingualism and biliteracy. We strive to prepare students for active linguistic and multicultural engagement, as well as lifelong learning beyond the high school experience. . These students are in the same classes that their regular IHS counterparts attend with the exception of world language; this is rolled into their Spanish Literature classes. The Spanish Literature courses do meet these students' world language college entry requirements and can be awarded college world language credit through Lane Community College.

COMMON GROUND

While language arts (LA) and social science (SS) areas are program specific to IHS and Honors, areas of math (MA), science (SC) and world language (AF) are not designated IB or Honors until advanced levels are attained. Then courses may be AP or IB or CN may be designated AP/IB/CN (College Now - see category below).

EUGENE 4j DIPLOMA SEAL

In order to graduate with the Eugene 4j Diploma Seal, students must have a 3.5 cumulative GPA at graduation, 25 high school credits, and complete 120 hours of documented community service.

HONORS

The Honors Program requires additional reading, writing and research in the Language Arts. Courses in grades 9 and 10 are designated as honors on the transcript. Students have the option of enrolling in honors level coursework in language arts, social studies, or both. Typically, students enrolled in honors courses will be well prepared to transition to Advanced Placement (AP) courses in junior and senior years.
